

## **Veronica Rossman Key Facts**

Nominated to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit

- Veronica Rossman brings extensive experience in both the trial and appellate sections of the Office of the Federal Public Defender (FPD) for the Districts of Colorado and Wyoming.
  - She joined FPD as an assistant federal public defender in the trial division in 2002. She returned to the office's appellate division in 2010 and served as the Appellate Division Chief from 2015 to 2017.
  - Since 2017, she has served as senior counsel for the FPD and is responsible for supervising a team of appellate specialists.
  - Rossman also coordinates and supervises all retroactive relief projects in the Districts of Colorado and Wyoming. She currently oversees an effort to bring relief to hundreds of defendants eligible for compassionate release under the First Step Act of 2018.
- If confirmed, Rossman would be the first judge on the Tenth Circuit with experience as a public defender. Of the ten active judges on the court, five of them have experience as prosecutors.
- Rossman is an immigrant who was born in Moscow. Her family is Jewish and emigrated from the former Soviet Union as religious and political refugees in the 1970s. She became a U.S. citizen when she was in middle school.
